Two clearly off-side goals and some unusually slack defensive work led to a dubious defeat on a disappointing day. However, the game was always exciting, with both teams producing good football despite the heavy pitch. Institute could not have had a better start, scoring in the first minute. Conneely ran down the wing and won a corner. From the corner Mitchell hit the post and was sharp enough to hit in the rebound. A fine start and we kept the initiative for the opening minutes, with Lawlor attacking well down the right and Mitchell bursting through on several occasions. However, St. Kevin's fought back well and the right winger was causing Foulkes some problems. Eventually they scored two quick goals, one of which revealed holes in our defensive covering. Some of the defence - usually so reliable - were strangely hesitant in the tackle, and Holden was switched with Foulkes to cover their dangerous winger: this seemed to work as Holden kept him in check. Then came the first of two off-side goals, when the ball was put through the middle to a forward who was clearly off-side, and he strode forward to beat Wiggins. Wiggins made one outstanding save in this half when, on the floor from a previous save, he launched himself into the air to parry a goal-bound shot. Derbyshire was brought on for Virtue, who was being brushed off the ball a little too easily.

We kicked off in the second half determined to show our class, and we began to dominate the game early on. This pressure finally told: a good ball was played through the middle for Curlett to run onto, and he slotted the ball past the keeper very skilfully. All the good play was coming from us now, with Mitchell outstanding, and being well supported by Woods and Derbyshire. It was, therefore, particularly annoying to have another off-side goal against us, almost identical to the third. So two unfortunate decisions changed the course of the match, and these decisions seemed to upset the defence who gave away a sloppy fifth goal. However, Institute showed their Character when Lawlor scored a third goal.

Several players seemed out of touch, but everybody is human and nobody can be brilliant all the time. There were, nevertheless, one or two who performed to their usual standard, especially Harper whose defensive covering was superb, and Mitchell who tried so hard to inspire his men.

We should not be too worried about this "defeat", as a draw should have been the correct result, and the important thing is that we know that the better side did not win.

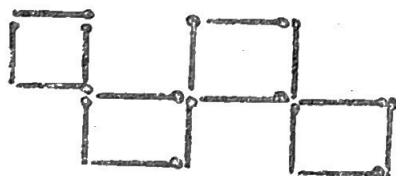

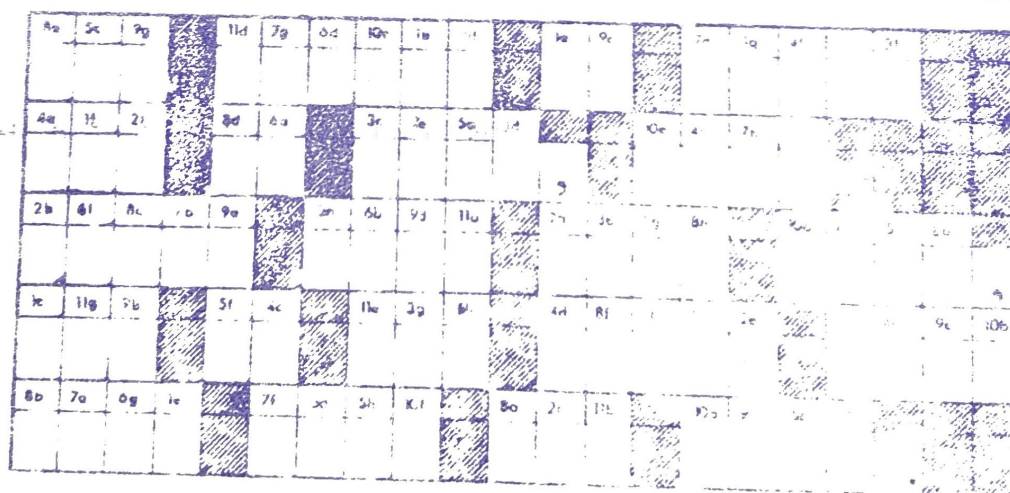
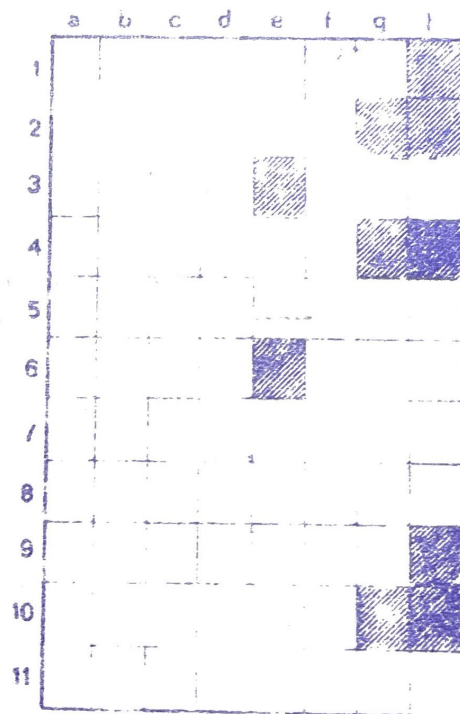
