Roby 3 Institute 1 Langford.

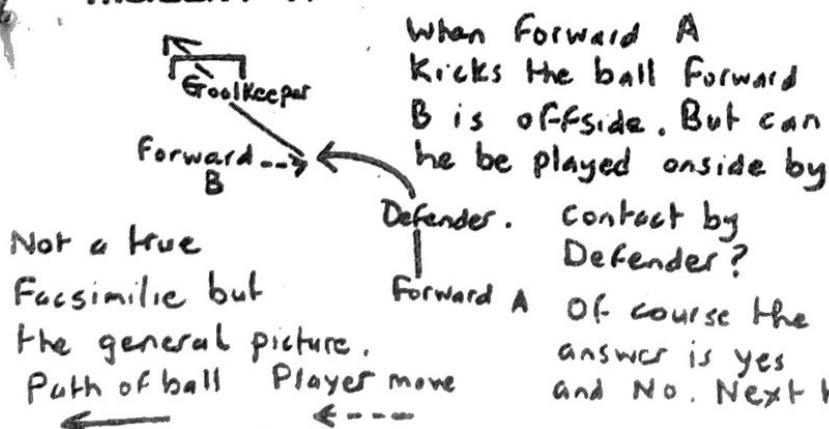

Rearranged side.

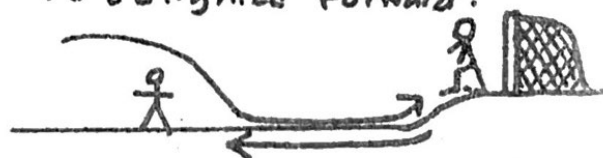

The pitch was waterlogged and this did not help Institute. In fact I think our main trouble is that we tend to play skillful football to extremes. This is why we sometimes miss the obvious when it comes to scoring. Madgin twice broke clear of the defence and came close to scoring. In the early stages Institute stretched the Roby defence with fast breaks. Hamilton came to the rescue twice with superbly timed tackles that persuaded the right winger that there was little in this game for him. Tragedy struck in the 15th minute. It was ironic that two of Roby's goals can be put at the 'door' of Chellew. Normally one of the safest goalkeepers in the school, he only plays out because we are 'blessed' with other goalkeepers like Naughton and Phillipson, when a skidding corner came into the goal-mouth Chellew let the ball slip out of his hands and gave Roby a 'gift'. Langford equalised shortly after and with Hassell completely controlling the midfield it looked as if the 2nd half was ours. Phair and Hooper had fitted well into the defence giving very little away. Warburton looked dangerous down the drier flanks but Bennett tire as the game went on and with Madgin and Langford looking a little predictable goals did not come. We had many chances but the final kick was nearly always weak. O'shaughnessy was playing well with Hassell but after 20 minutes two quick disasters finished Institute. First a deflected cross-come-centre reached an offside forward. Was he played on or offside. Well you can interpret that rule in two ways. I am only amazed that I gave the advantage to Roby. Charity rules OK. Within minutes another Chellew slip finished us off. The ball splashed in a puddle and slowed down on the slope in front of him. Instead of picking the harmless ball up Chellew saw a Roby Forward step up and tap the ball past him. The rain fell and we all trudged our weary way home - again justice has been seen not to be done.

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# SECOND YEARS WIN AT ROBY

Roby 1 Institute 3.

Heavy overnight rain which continued throughout the game made conditions very difficult at Roby on Saturday where a hard fought match ended in a 3-1 victory for Institute. Institute were generally in control but Roby managed to threaten the Institute goal several times as their smaller forwards found the Institute defence struggling to turn in the mud.

Institute opened strongly and took the lead after only 2 minutes when Dudley scored with a tremendous shot from the left wing. Roby gradually came into the game and equalised after 15 minutes when the Institute defence were caught by a through ball. Rooke came out well to block the first shot but another Roby forward was following up and able to score. Institute returned to the attack and had three or four half chances which they were unable to take and half time came with the score still level.

Roby had their best spell in the first five minutes of the second half and after having one 'goal' disallowed for offside, missed the easiest chance of the match shooting over the bar from two yards. Institute then regained control and as the half went on got more and more on top as their greater strength began to tell, but still Rooke had to come to the rescue on a few occasions, coming quickly off his line as Roby broke through. Midway through the half Institute regained the lead when a cross by Dudley was turned into the goal by McLoughlin, making his first appearance for the team. Two minutes later it was 3-1 when Gyo took advantage of a defensive mix up to score a simple goal. Institute were now well on top and had several chances to increase their lead but despite several near misses the game ended 3-1.

A fine victory then and all 12 players (+ 3 supporters) deserve a medal for putting up such a great effort.

The teams were somewhat rearranged last Wednesday. Jamieson dropped both Lintott and Bailey and the 'new' side performed very well giving Eyo's XI a hard fight for victory. Jamieson's XI should have won this game easily, but some unfortunate errors allowed Eyo to lead his team to a fine recovery.

After 8 minutes a corner on the left was tapped home by Flanagan from 2 yards. Shortly after Flanagan broke through the defence after picking up a great pass from Johnson. Flanagan took the ball towards goal before unleashing a deadly shot that gave Rooke no chance. In the 15th minute Flanagan completed his hat trick with another superb goal. This time it was Carter who provided the 'killer' pass. Again Rooke was given no chance at all. At this stage Jamieson's XI looked unbeatable, completely controlling the game. Pimblett was 100% more dangerous than last week, getting really involved in play. Johnson and Tony Jones were playing well. The trouble really started when Richardson was penalised for taking too many steps. The resulting free kick saw the ball bang against the post. Baker hesitated far too long in clearing the ball and Mcgloughlin seized his opportunity and scored. Now Flanagan was robbed of a fourth goal by a super save from Rooke. At the other end it was again Mcgloughlin (sorry about the spelling) he is in 2A who broke clear and he took his chance beautifully. His shot 'scorched' into the net. At half time the score was 3-2.

Within two minutes of the restart Jamieson's XI had regained a 2 goal lead. Carter moved down the right wing before unleashing a fine shot that went into the corner of the net. Carter was having a great game playing very well down the right wing. He easily beat his defender and laid on some great passes that team mates did not convert. Another 'steps' error allowed Eyo's XI to fight their way back into the game. From the free kick Parry hammered the ball home. Minutes from the end Richardson made a fantastic save to give him comfort for making earlier errors.

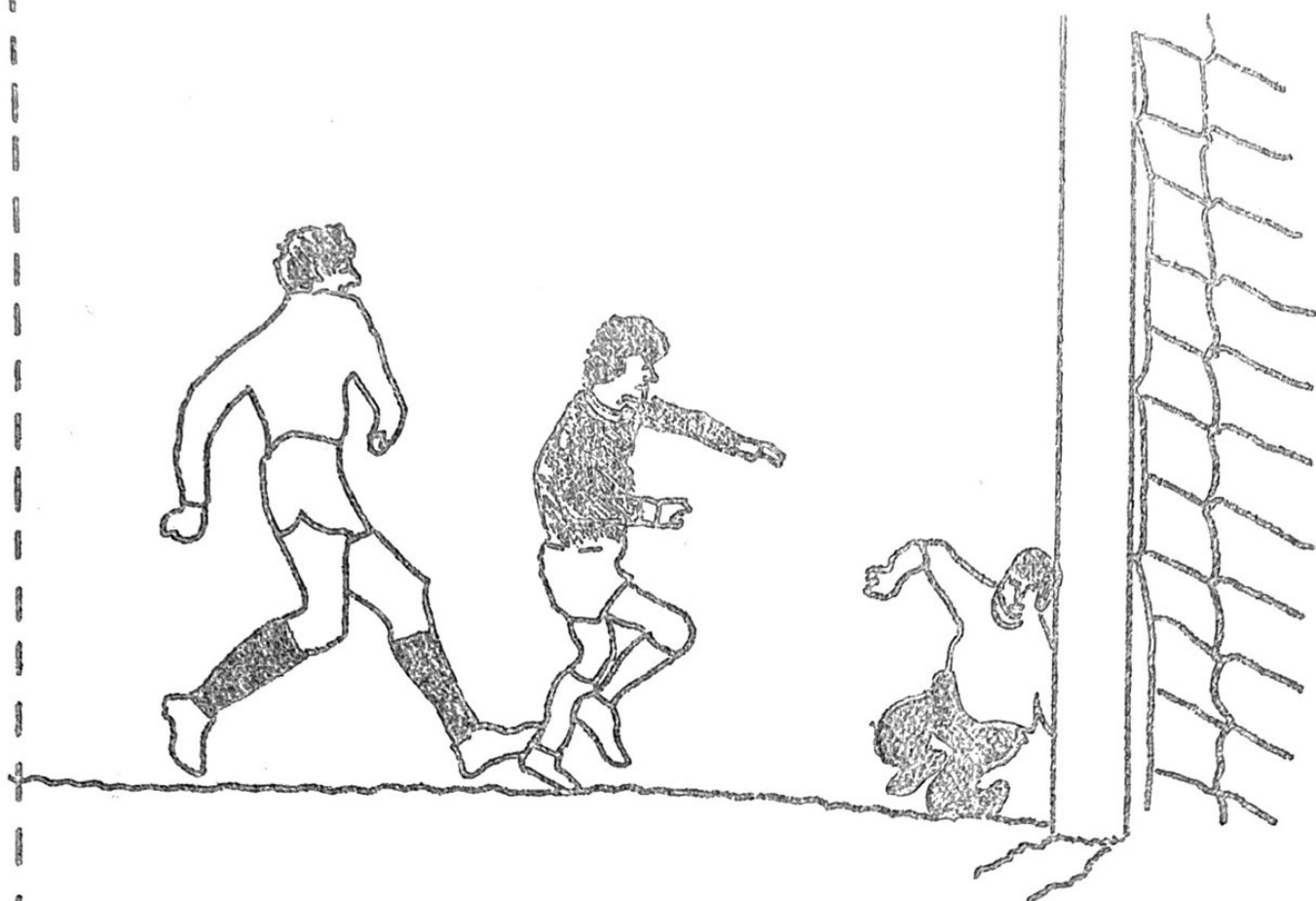

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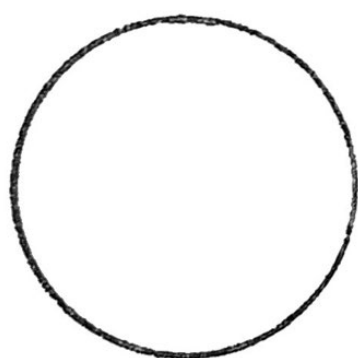

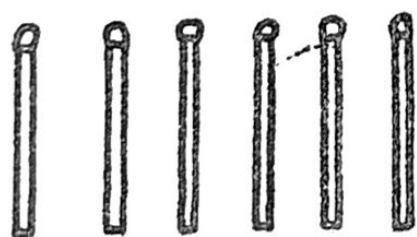
