BARRY LEE TOO FAST FOR HOLT AS HE SCORES 4 IN 7-2 WIN.

In the very first minute Institute should have taken the lead. A fine interception by Eaves and resulting pass sent Johnson away. His shot beat the goalkeeper but struck the base of the post. Eaves was showing up well in these early minutes and his next contribution was a thundering volley that went narrowly wide. As well as Eaves Barry Lee was showing an impressive turn of speed and danger threatened every time he collected the ball.

At the other end Hassell as usual was a reliable and confidence inspiring skipper and on one occasion a fine tackle relieved the danger. However, it was Barry Lee who finished it all off with an opportunist goal. He picked up a loose clearance and cracked the ball into the back of the net.

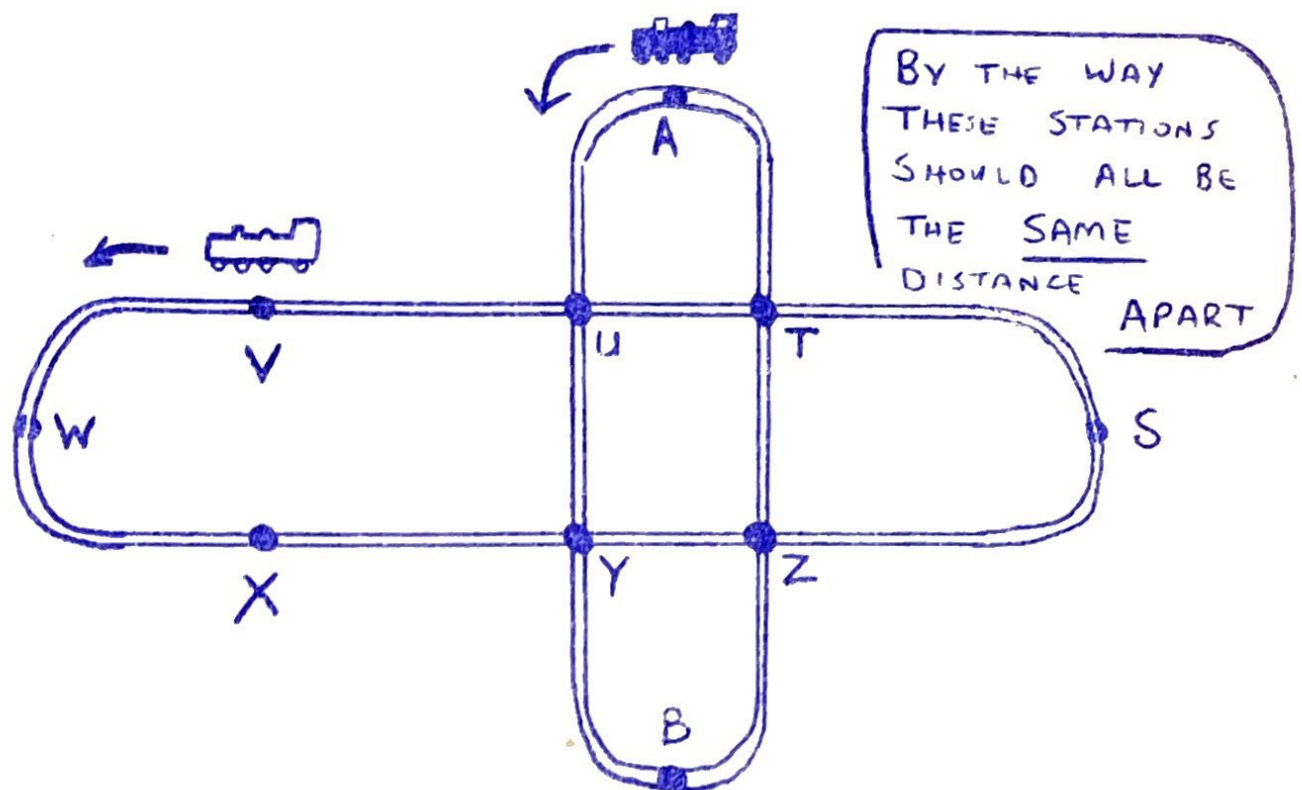
