It was a dull morning.

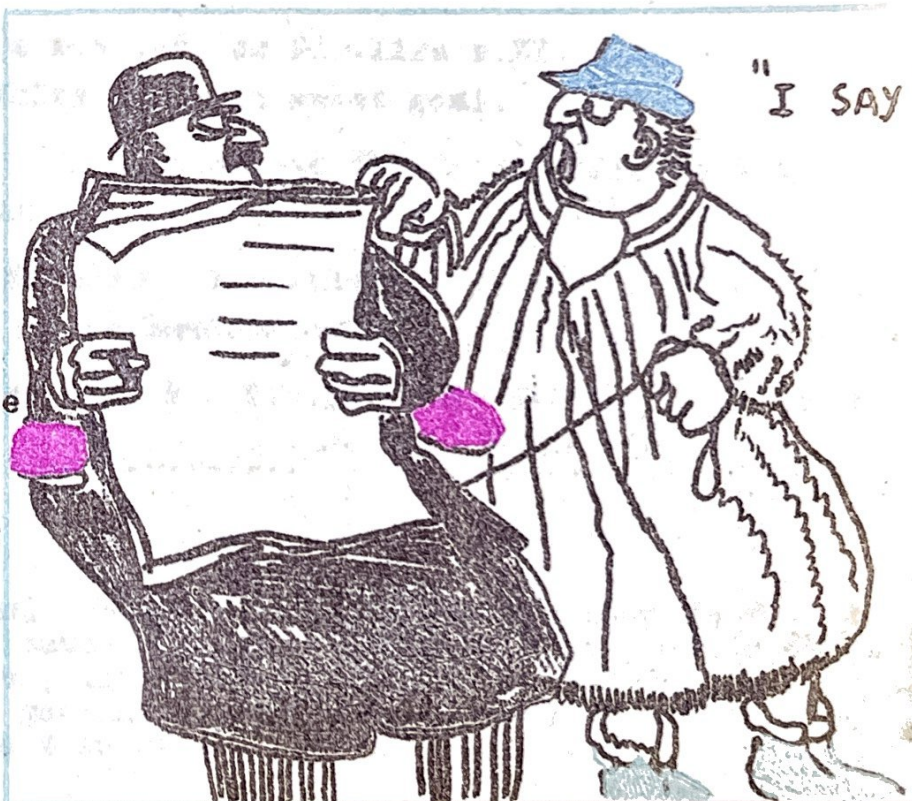
The game started; Halewood looked lively, especially the centre forward. Institute were awarded a free kick and from fully 30 yards John Brown scored with a direct kick.

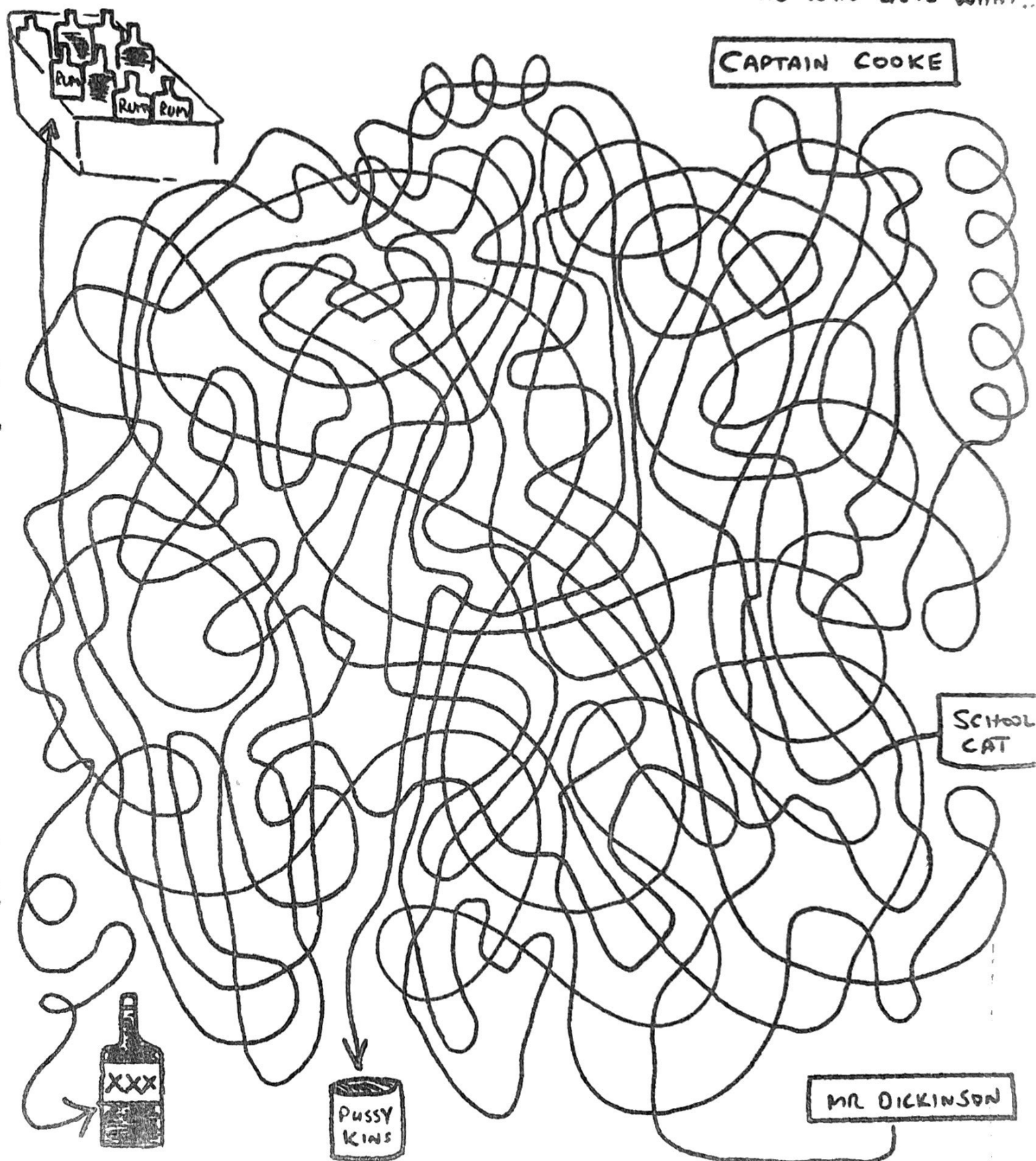
